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New Homesites in Lacamas Shores

After many months of planning and negotiations the Forest Glen development, which adjoins Lacamas Shores to the South of Michaelbrook, was approved by the City and clearing and construction is underway.

The Lacamas Shores Homeowners Association (LSHOA) Board took the unprecedented step of petitioning the neighborhood to authorize direct negotiation of a deal to allow the Developer (Homesite Development) to utilize a buffer strip of common land owned by the association. The neighborhood overwhelmingly approved the petition.

As a result of the approval of the petition and numerous meeting with our members, City officials, the developer and ourselves, the board negotiated and signed on to a joint agreement allowing development of 13 homesites and an access road connecting with Michaelbrook.

The efforts of the Board resulted in inclusion of four of the homesites, that will now front Michaelbrook Lane, becoming members of the LSHOA and subject to all the building requirements of other homes in the neighborhood. This maintains a seamless string of homes along Michaelbrook that are part of our HOA and will assist in maintaining the visual appeal and property values of our neighborhood. The remaining 9 homesites will also have construction requirements that mirror the current standards set by the LSHOA CCR's. Many of the properties are already sold.

While many local developments go through contentious debates and arguments among involved parties, the careful investigation, deliberations and negotiations by the Board resulted in satisfying win-win agreements with the City, Developer and LSHOA. We hope this also sets a precedent for the coming development of the Bafus property, which was purchased by the same developer. They have already indicated their willingness to work closely with us on the plans.

Homeowner's Assessments due January 31, 2006

The 2006 Homeowner's Assessments were mailed out in November. Payment must be received by January 31, 2006 to avoid late penalties and property liens. Please mark your calendar as you will not receive additional reminders.

If you are a lot owner, a letter will be sent to request your intentions on maintaining your lot. Please return the bottom portion of the letter no later than December 31, 2005. Invoices for the 2006 Lot Maintenance Program will be mailed out in the beginning of February.

You've Got The POWER!

The Lacamas Shores Homeowner's Board is often presented with questions from homeowners that are outside of the Board's control. Some areas of concern can be resolved by homeowners themselves getting involved. Listed below are some ideas on how to resolve some ongoing situations:

Fast Drivers

If you notice a car that constantly drives fast in the neighborhood, get a description and the license plate number. Report this information to the police and they will pay a visit to the owner of the car and give them a warning. Also, you can call the police and request that a patrol car sit in the neighborhood to give out tickets to people driving too fast. Another option would be to have the speed radar machine located in our neighborhood to advise drivers of their speed. Ask the police department to add your street location to the sign up list so that the radar machine can be located in your area for a week.

How to Handle Unwanted Solicitors

Solicitors are required to obtain a City of Camas Solicitor's License which requires a background check. If you do not know the person at the door, ask to see their solicitor's license. If they are unable to present one to you, kindly say you are not interested and shut the door. Then call the police to notify them that there are solicitors in the neighborhood without a license. The police can be reached M-F 8:00-5:00 at 834.4151, and after hours at 911. Be prepared to

describe the person and tell them the direction they were heading after leaving your house. The police will follow up and advise the solicitors of the licensing requirement. If the solicitor returns to the neighborhood, they will be fined.

Animal Issues

Dogs that bark constantly for more than ten minutes or off and on for more than 30 minutes can be reported to the Animal Control department. If the barking occurs after 5:00, call 911 and let them know that you live in Camas and would like a police officer to come and talk to the homeowner with the barking dog. Many neighbors have had sleepless nights due to barking dogs and the dog owner may not even realize that it is having an impact on their neighbors. Unfortunately the Lake has a tendency of echoing the barking noise. Please invest in devices that control barking if your dog has this problem.

Also, dog owners are required to pick up after their dog. It is against City Ordinance to leave your dog's feces in public places. Dog owners that do not pick up after their dogs can be reported to the City by calling Animal Control at 834.4151.

Water, Sewer Problems

Please contact the City of Camas to have them look at any issues you are having.

Trees Need Pruning??

There are a number of residents of Lacamas Shores, whose landscaping includes trees that extend over the sidewalk. In some instances, these trees have limbs that make it difficult to walk on the sidewalk, and could make it dangerous to do so. Landscaping is the responsibility of the owner of the lot containing the trees and

bushes, along with the liability for any injuries or damage caused by that landscaping. In most cases some minor pruning would be an easy solution for both the property owner and those using the sidewalks. Good neighbor policy would prompt those with trees near the sidewalk, to look at their landscaping, and if there is a potential problem, take appropriate action.

This fund was the result of a neighborhood reserve study to determine possible future expenses so the budget could be properly prepared for them avoiding special assessments. The study showed that we should be in good shape for about the next twenty years.

Serving on the Board has been a great way to meet my neighbors and become involved in the future of our neighborhood. I urge all neighbors to serve at least one term on the Board. Here are the rules:

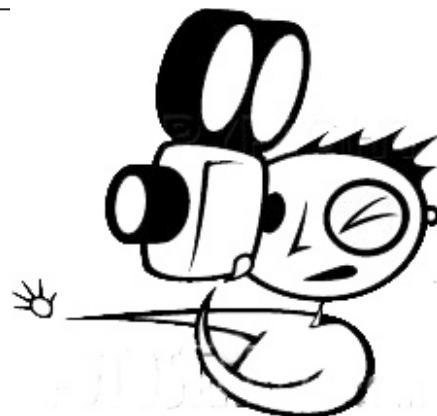
- No Politics

Ask Mr. Etiquette

Dear Mr. E,

I was at a friend's home one evening and in a fit of exuberance (or maybe too much wine) I invited a bunch of my neighbors over for a Holiday Cocktail party. I am not a good cook

and I don't have a clue how to organize such a venture. Is there an easy guide to entertaining?

Chewing on Foot in Mouth

Dear Chewing,

You are in for a treat! The cocktail party is a great way to mingle with your friends and neighbors in a casual atmosphere. There are plenty of party guides available in book stores and on line, but with my expert help, you won't need to bother with that. Here is an easy guide for a simple holiday cocktail party.

Although you invited your friends by word of mouth, they won't know your serious unless they receive a formal invitation. That invitation may be written or emailed (informal only) and should include the type of party, date, time, place and dress. There are many gorgeous papers available that allow you to print your own invitations on your computer or you can buy pre-made invitations that you just fill in the blanks. Be sure to include RSVP information.

One thing you won't have to worry about at a Holiday Party is the decorating. Your home will already be decorated for the holidays. You may wish to purchase a special centerpiece for the hors d'oeuvre table. Also be sure to keep open flames/candles away from areas where people are wandering, leaning, or setting food and drink. Music sets the mood and is very important to your party. Since it is a holiday party, christmas music is in order but keep it festive.

The number of guests will determine how much food and drink you will require. A cocktail party is not dinner and should be set for early evening (think cocktail hour) or after 7 p.m. and should last about 2 hours. You may want to decide on a "signature drink" such as a Pomegranate Martini or Champagne Cocktail, to cut down on the number of bottles and mixers you will need. Be sure to have plenty of glasses (please no plastic) and wine, beer, soft drinks and water available. If you and your friends prefer, you can have a party without the alcohol. Just substitute juices and soft drinks for the alcohol and the rest is the same. Plan on approximately two drinks per guest. If possible, hire a bartender or ask a friend to help with the drinks.

At a "Cocktail Party" the guests mostly stand and food should be easy to eat with fingers or little cocktail picks. Always have a place for guests to dispose of the picks. You should plan on 3 - 5 morsels per person and they should be no more than 2 bites each. Be sure to have small plates available and place lots of cocktail napkins around the rooms where people will be gathering.

Now about the "no-cooking" part. You won't need a huge selection of appetizers and with a little ingenuity, you won't have to cook a thing. Be sure you shop at a store that will have fresh ingredients

and a "killer" deli such as Whole Foods and Elephants in Portland. You could probably pick up a great assortment just from their selection alone. The freezer department of Trader Joes has a number of good appetizers that only need to be warmed before serving. But just in case you want to do some of your own, below are some ideas. Be sure to arrange your hors d'oeuvres on attractive dishes preferable of different sizes and heights. Use a pedestal cake plate or put a plate on a upside down bowl to create an interesting look. Garnish with greens, fruits, lemons/limes or, since it's a holiday party, christmas balls, bells or fake greenery.

Scoop out 3/4 inch slices of English cucumbers and fill with purchased seafood salad such as crab or shrimp.

Toast triangles of pita bread and serve with hummus, drizzled with good olive oil and sprinkled with ground cumin or other spices.

Spread cream cheese or goat cheese on crackers or cocktail bread and top with purchased tapenade.

Serve large shrimp with a purchased pesto dip.

Pick two or three great cheeses (ask the cheese person) and serve with fruit and nuts.

Set out bowls of good olives and nuts.

Learn to make one amazing appetizer from scratch. It will give you something to fall back on and the accolades of your guests will encourage you to try others in the future.

The possibilities are endless. Avoid pre-made trays from your local grocery store unless you are standing there watching them being prepared. Sometimes the food has been setting too long and you don't want to make your guests sick.

Now all that is left to do is mix yourself a cocktail and get ready to greet your guests.

Remember, good manners is the art of making others feel comfortable.
